The 36-storey condo tower perches atop a 10-floor, primarily glass podium facing Lake Ontario. The tower also includes retail, office, and daycare space along with plentiful "gardens in the sky." The building is expected to achieve LEED Gold.

Safdie has designed some of Canada's most well-known landmarks, including Habitat at Expo 67, Toronto's Pearson Airport Terminal One, and Canada's National Art Gallery.

This is one of several LEED candidate buildings Enermodal is currently working on in Toronto, including the Cadillac Fairview RBC Centre (LEED Gold candidate), the Bay Adelaide Centre (LEED Gold candidate), 246 and 252 Sackville – Regent Park (LEED Gold candidates), and the AllStream Centre (LEED Silver candidate).
