## Enermodal Community Services: A green statement

### The Enermodal Philosophy

Community service buildings tell the story of a city or town. These libraries and youth/community centres provide a services to families and youth, a place to house local history, culture, and knowledge, and a glimpse into residents' connection to one another and the environment.

Enermodal believes that LEED community services buildings demonstrate a community's commitment to environmental responsibility and represent a gift to its future generations.

### Featured Projects

**Collingwood Public Library** (Collingwood, Ontario) – This three-storey, LEED Gold candidate library and City employee office building features large windows for daylighting and views of occupants and guests, demand-controlled ventilation for energy savings and occupant comfort, and a ground source heat pump to provide all heating and cooling.

**Durango Public Library** (Durango, Colorado) – This LEED Gold certified library includes underfloor air distribution for energy savings and occupant comfort, daylighting sensors, and views to the outdoors for every occupied space.

**North East Centre of Community** (Calgary, Alberta) – This LEED Silver candidate facility houses a YMCA (including a gym and pool), library, community function rooms, and offices.
