Enermodal has worked on several LEED certified buildings for religious communities, taking into account the distinct mission and needs of each. For these groups, LEED certification is tangible proof of "walking the talk."

Featured Projects

Villa Angela (Chatham, Ontario) – Certified LEED Gold in 2007, Villa Angela is a home for the Urselines of Chatham and addresses two issues of regional importance: habitat loss and water waste. As a result, native species were planted throughout the site and low-flow fixtures were installed to achieve 59% water savings compared with a conventional building.

St. Gabriel's Passionist Parish (Toronto, Ontario) – Designed to embody a theology of a mutually-enhancing earth-human relationship, this LEED Gold certified parish includes a "living wall" of tropical plants, which purifies ventilation air.

Sisters of St. Joseph Residence (London, Ontario) – Featuring an Enermodal Signature Green Education Kiosk, this LEED Gold certified residence is designed to show visitors the sisters' commitment to environmental stewardship.
